COVER VEHICLE FEATURE ARTICLE

Wayne Bostak's 1957 Ford Thunderbird

1) Wayne purchased this car from a local friend who did a frame-off restoration in the late 1970's. This car is painted in Ford Starmist Blue. Around 21,380 Thunderbirds were produced in 1957. The 1955, 1956 & 1957 are known as the first generation T-birds or "Little Birds".

2) It's a snug fit in this two seat "personal luxury car". This car features power steering, power brakes, power seat and a "Fordomatic" 3 speed automatic transmission.

3) The 312 cubic inch (5.1 liter), 245 horsepower, overhead valve, Y Block engine comes with a four barrel carburetor. The engine compartment is "1957 correct". It includes the optional engine dress up kit: aluminum valve covers and chrome air cleaner.

4) The round taillights harken to the "space rocket exhaust" look of the late 50's. The exhaust comes out both of the bumper openings. The spare tire is mounted vertically in the large and spacious trunk.

5) The removable hardtop has "porthole" windows to improve rear quarter visibility. Wayne also has the convertible top frame (without cover) and real Kelsey Hayes wire wheels (not hub caps) for this car. Due to other car interests at the moment, Wayne's car is now for sale.

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THE GLIDDEN TROPHY & TOURS

Apart from the Glidden Tour, women were a part of the adventure of early touring. In the summer of 1909, Mrs. John Ramsey and her three women traveling companions drove 4,500 miles from New York City to Oakland, California, in 35 days. The car was a **Maxwell-Briscoe**. Among the reported provisions, other than considerable luggage, were cooking equipment, shovels, picks and rope. The report did not note where they got gasoline, tires, and other essentials for travel during those days. In comparison, the Pathfinder team for the 1909 Glidden, albeit traveling in the wet month of April, took 38 days to get from Detroit to Kansas City. Go Girls!

The rules were changed for the Glidden in 1910. An article in the American Motorist, AAA's publication at the time, provided details of the "fixed penalty schedule" which would result in the award of the Glidden Trophy to the car with the smallest penalty. Among other things, the cars had to pass an inspection at the end of the run. This led to a post event lawsuit by Premier, contesting the AAA Contest Board decision, who claimed that an oiler was a stock item when, according to the New York State Supreme Court, by dismissal, it wasn't. Things were getting serious! (There is a whole file on this dispute.) Penalties were awarded (is that the right term?) for being late at a control point, for working on the cars, for failing to meet specified operational test specifications after the event and for having various things break, shake, fail, or leak. I could extract the details from this article, but I am afraid that someone in our hierarchy might decide to use these as a basis of scoring in a CARavan. However, I will have a second article on the new rules.

1910 had 14 touring cars running 2,851 miles from Cincinnati, OH to Chicago, IL through Kentucky, Tennessee, Alabama, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Iowa and western Illinois. The award had two results. The referee awarded the prize to Ray McNamara in a **Premier "6"** and the Contest Board awarded the prize to Mr. Bolger in a **Chalmers**. Premier protested, see above. The trophy went to **Chalmers**.

1911 required a change in route. Originally, this was to be routed from Washington D.C. to Ottawa, Canada in June. It finally was run from New York City to Jacksonville, FL in October. (The first of the CCCA snowbirds?) The route covered 1,454 miles and had 18 teams of three cars entered. The Tarrytown Team (**Maxwell**) won. The Anderson SC Trophy, initiated this year, was awarded to the Honorable Hoke Smith of Atlanta GA. This trophy was awarded to the individual car making the best score on AAA reliability tours.

The 1912 event was canceled. Originally, it was to be run from the 7th through the 22nd of October. It was postponed a week, then abandoned entirely due to the "Spring floods and the bad conditions of the roads as a sequel to the floods." According to the records, Mr. Glidden made the trip anyhow in the company of another car. The AAA National Touring Trophy was initiated for this event.

The last Glidden Tour was held in 1913, covering 1,300 miles. It drew 25 automobiles for the route from Minneapolis to Glacier Park, Montana. The prize went to the Boston Team driving **Metz** autos. The AAA Touring Trophy, originated this year, went to Dr. J. D. Park of Duluth in a **Locomobile**. The citation for the award reads: "The first part of the journey was strenuous on account of the nature of the soil, clay and gumbo in many sections.

Touring in the Northwest is very much a weather proposition, rain rendering the roads so difficult of navigation that even skillful and careful driving does not always keep the car in the tracks. The roads were soft and treacherous on the first day and the first night found some of the drivers well worn from the unusual exertions of voyaging through the inland seas." The Perpetual Automobile Touring Trophy went to a **Hupmobile** after a draw in a five-way tie.

The Daily News cup went to a **Metz** after a tie and a draw.

People who shall remain nameless have made comments on the discomforts from failures of their cars during CARavans. Today we have paved roads, although we also have somewhat increased traffic volumes. I don't think that we would want to take one of the nicely restored Full Classic [™] cars through a Glidden route. We might never get the mud out of the wheel bearings.

For those who develop the route and plot the directions for a contemporary CARavan, the planning for the 1910 Glidden Tour may be of interest: "June 15 is the probable date for the tentative route which starts from Cincinnati via ------ to Chicago. While the distance is approximately 2,300 miles, this mileage may be increased or diminished according to the conditions met with during the official path-finding tour, which will begin its work about April 15." (American Motorist, Vol II, No. 3, April ,1910.) The routes were marked with paper streamers to designate proper turns. (I guess that they didn't have car-mounted GPS systems to record the route to 0.1 miles, plus or minus 30 feet.)

In 1914, AAA determined that the promotion of reliability and technical development of automobiles was going to be better in racing and they switched their sponsorship to the Indianapolis 500.

The Glidden Tours were revived in 1946 by M. J. Duryea, son of the early automobile builder. AAA joined in the sponsorship of the event in 1962, its 60th anniversary. Other clubs involved with the revival included the VMCCA, AACA, and the HCCA.

AAA moved its headquarters to Heathrow FL a few years ago. If you want to see the trophies in the photos, exit I-4 at Exit 101-A, CR 46-A, and head a half mile west to Heathrow International Blvd. The AAA headquarters building is about a mile south, to the right, at 1000 AAA Blvd.

The black prancing stallion emblem adorned a number of World War I fighter planes piloted

by Italian Count Francesco Baracca, an accomplished equestrian known as "the cavalier of the skies." After the pilot's death, the count's mother presented the emblem to Enzo Ferrari, who added the canaryyellow background and the colors of the Italian flag across the top. It has



been the symbol of Ferrari ever since.

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
Crane Cams Factory Tour

This October, I was fortunate to take a factory tour of the Crane Cams facility located in an industrial park about 5 minutes from the Daytona International Speedway. Crane Cams makes valve train parts such as camshafts, lifters, rocker arms, etc. and ignition systems such as distributors , coils, spark plug wires, etc. for all kinds of internal combustion engines



(automotive, marine, racing, farm equipment, etc.). They just moved into their new building in January of 2012. This was their first factory tour in 5 years. A group of us 8 gearheads were led into the first room which consisted of a fancy distributor tester.



The second room had their "Spintron" tester where they can run a camshaft in an engine without a crankshaft or pistons, powered by an electric motor.





What was amazing about the Spintron was that it is powered by 480 volts(!) and is computer controled, so that entire race laps can be programmed into the motor. The engine block has part of the cylinder sleeve cut out so the Crane Cams engineers can point lasers at the underside and above the valves to look for potential problem areas.

Our last stop on the tour was the factory floor where they hand make all their camshafts. I was forbidden from taking any of my own photos on the shop floor, The photo below is from Crane Cams Facebook page of a tour later that day.



Jerry was the the informative tour guide (in the black shirt) for our group. On the table above are the steps to make a camshaft. From raw metal bars, to rough machined part, to semi finished, to final product. Crane Cams have no CNC machines.

The actual camshaft grinding machines were really interesting. They are modified Italian crankshaft grinding machines and are accurate to within 0.001 inches. They can work on camshafts up to 44 inches long! We spoke to one machinist as he was working on a tractor camshaft. He seemed very passionate about his work and seemed to be a true craftsman. I am trying to arrange a factory tour for our club.
