HAPPY BIRTHDAY Florida Region AACA!



Classics at the Beach Car Show

The 17th annual Classics at the Beach car show was held on April 7, 2013 at the Elliot Museum on Hutchinson Island in Stuart, Florida (about 2.5 hours southeast of Orlando). A strong group of around 60 private vehicles from the south Florida area were on display. The weather was overcast and in the high 70's. It did not rain on all the beautiful cars in the museum's parking lot. This year's show was by invitation only. Participants had to submit photos of their vehicles to the museum and if the museum selected your vehicle the entry fee for the show was \$200 per car.

The show vehicles were mainly American, British and German. The oldest car there was a **1926 Durant Star Landau Sedan**. The newest was a **2012 McLaren MP4 12C Coupe** (a half million dollar super car). Also at the show were 2 vintage drag race cars and a few low production vehicles.

PEOPLE'S CHOICE WINNER

Sitting unattended with no barriers around it (see the photo above) was this lovely two tone **1935 Duesenberg Model "J"** originally fitted with a sweep—panel phaeton body by LaGrande. It was later rebodied with a Willoughby Berline body. It was also upgraded with a supercharger. It claims to now have 320 horsepower in "SJ" specification.



V-12 PACKARD

Just a few cars down from the "Duesy" was this **1938 Packard Convertible** with a 175 horsepower V-12 engine (473 cubic inches) that "was capable of reaching 100 mph". The owner was sitting next to the car and was very friendly. This car has the vertical grill openings that are controlled by the thermostat and close in the cold to help starting and warm up. The car has 30,000 original miles, and he is the second owner. It rides on a 124 inch wheelbase and weighs 5,255 pounds.

COVER VEHICLE FEATURE ARTICLE 1941 Ford Pickup Truck

- 1) Bill Morris bought this one owner truck in 1984 from the son of the original owner in College Park (a suburb of Orlando). All the truck body panels are painted and are waiting for reassembly. On the far left is the original 1941 radiator that has two cores... to allow for the engine hand crank to pass through the center. Bill plans on finishing the truck this year.
- 2) The truck originally came with an 85 horsepower flathead V-8 engine with a 2 barrel carburetor. In Bill's hands is the unique distributor assembly used in 1941. There is a rotor inside that metal housing that ignites the 4 spark plug wires on each side.
- 3) Adjusting the distributor points and the spark advance is no simple task for this 1941 distributor. Bill uses a 1950's era Ford Distributor Stroboscope with special adapters to make his adjustments.
- 4) The original truck dash cleaned up nicely. There is a starter button on the dash. The ignition key locks the steering column. The truck uses the original 3 speed transmission and a 6 volt battery.
- **5**) The rear suspension is very basic. There is one transverse leaf spring for the rear suspension with friction shocks all around. In 1942, Ford trucks went with two longitudinal rear springs. A reproduction metal pickup bed will be added. Bill will use 6.50 x 16 inch bias ply reproduction tires all around his half ton pickup truck.

IT'S NOT A BMW BUT AN EMW

One of my favorite cars at the show was this tiny two tone **1954 EMW 327/3**, one of 152 coupes built at the old BMW factory in East Germany (Eisenacher Motorenwerk). The car is actually a **1937–39 BMW 327** but was built after WW II from pre–war parts and tooling. It is believed to be the only 327/3 in the United States. It's powered by a six-cylinder engine that displaces 1971cc and produces 55 horsepower. There is a four-speed manual gearbox and four-wheel drum brakes.







A VERY IMPRESSIVE BENTLEY

This **1931 Bentley 8 Liter Roadster** originally had a saloon body that was removed. Two feet were cut from the chassis reducing the wheelbase

from 13 feet 6 inches to 11 feet 5 inches. It was rebodied for racing in the early 1930's.

The engine is a massive 8 Liter (487 cubic inch) overhead cam, straight six engine with a claimed 220 bhp. The engine featured 4 valves per cylinder and dual ignition (coil plus magneto). The engine crankcase is made from a magnesium alloy called Elektron.

Between 1930 and 1932 only 100 of these 8 Liter Bentleys were made. Only 78 are believed to exist today and only 16 were built with open bodywork. They all featured custom coachwork, mainly from the firms in England.

The 8 Liter came at the end of Bentley's glory years as an independent automaker. Rolls-Royce, Bentley's competition, bought the company in 1931 and immediately disposed of all 8 Liter spare parts.







Seen at a Local Car Show

While at the March 30, 2013 (Saturday) Old Town Cruise in Kissimmee, FL, I saw this interesting Jeep truck produced by Willys Motors. It's a rare, all original **1958 Jeep FC-150 3/4 ton pickup truck** with a 6 foot cargo bed. FC stands for Forward Control (or cab over engine design). These trucks were made between 1956 and 1964. Total FC production was around 30,000 units.

According to the owner, the truck uses a CJ-5 Jeep chassis (body on frame) with a 81 inch wheelbase and a 57 inch track.



This truck has full

time all wheel drive. It is powered by a 128 cubic inch overhead valve 4 cylinder engine with 78 horsepower and 114 foot-pounds of torque. The stock 3 speed transmission comes with a hi-low transfer case. Top speed, per the owner, is around 50 mph.

These vehicles were marketed as work vehicles "for corporate, municipal, military, as well as civilian use. Regular pickup box beds were standard, but customers were offered a large number of "Jeep approved" specialized bodies from outside suppliers. These ranged from simple flatbeds to complete tow trucks, dump trucks and fire trucks.(1)"

At the show were 3 real 60's Shelby Mustangs. One GT350 and two GT500's. The black **1967 Shelby GT350** has an original Paxton supercharger on the 289 cubic inch engine. The gold **1968 Shelby GT500 Convertible** had the 428 cubic inch engine. The red **1967 Shelby GT500** (behind the white Mustang in the photo above) had the 428 cubic inch engine with two four barrel carburetors.

A beautiful maroon **1946 Ford Convertible Super Deluxe** was at the show. The owner was never around so I wasn't able to ask about the car's history or unique features. The car entry form listed the owner of the car as Gene Garrison from Port Richey, FL. The engine was a 232 cubic inch flathead V-8. It had a manual transmission shift lever on the steering column.
