1966 Volvo Nears 3 Million Road Miles



Irv Gordon's **1966 Volvo P1800S** is within 3,000 miles of the three million mile mark. The retired school teacher from Long Island plans on reaching his goal in Alaska sometime in September 2013.

"His story is famous: 24-year-old Irv bought a brand-new 1800S on Friday, June 30, 1966 – it cost \$4,150, an entire year's salary, he recalls – and by the following Monday, he'd put 1,500 miles on the odometer. This middle school science teacher's 125-mile round-trip commute, plus his love of road-tripping adventure, meant that he'd racked up 500,000 miles by the late 1970s, and in 1987, cracked 1,000,000. Irv retired from teaching in 1996 and started driving in earnest; he and the car were honored in The Guinness Book of World Records in 1998 at 1,690,000 million miles, and he reached 2,000,000 miles in 2002. He's been driving ever since. "

The famous ORMOND GARAGE

The Ormond Garage was a staging point for the very first race in this area. The first sanctioned meet here in Ormond Beach, Florida, March 26-28, 1903, featured time trials and races for a field including Alexander Winton's "Bullet", Ransom E. Olds' "Pirate" and Oscar Hedstrom's Indian motorcycle. The racers broke U.S. and world records and Ormond Beach became a favorite venue for motor sports and automobile testing. Ormond became the 'Birthplace Of Speed'. When few roads in America were paved, this hard beach became the race-course of choice.

So you can see that the Ormond Garage was of great historical significance. To the grief of many self-appointed historians, such as myself, this beautiful "gasoline alley" was destroyed by fire on January 7, 1976. Over the years, many visitors and locals wondered

where the Ormond Garage was. In 2009, The Motor Racing Heritage Association asked the city for permission to build a small replica of the Ormond Garage in the Birthplace Of Speed Park. This park is located at the Granada Boulevard beach approach. It already was the home of several marble markers that commemorate the history of early racing on Ormond Beach.

With financial support from the Chapman Root family and many others, the replica Garage is finally essentially complete. It will be the home of the two (2) monument cars, the Winton Bullet and the Olds Pirate. These car monuments were commissioned by the City of Ormond during the 2003 Centennial in Ormond, the celebration of the 100-year anniversary of the first race in the area. The new garage will also serve as a tribute to the original garage that was destroyed by fire.

Can you imagine going 136.4 MPH on a V-8 powered motorcycle? Glenn Hammond Curtiss did it on January 24, 1907 on Ormond Beach. He was considered the "Fastest Man On Earth "until 1911.

Kendra and I were hanging-out at New Smyrna Beach when we got word that the new Ormond Garage was to be dedicated at 2 p.m. Thursday, March 28. Even though the Garage wasn't quite finished, the dedication had to take place because this date was the 110-year anniversary of the race between Winton and Olds. As you might expect, a large group of city officials, historians, the Motor Racing Heritage Association president, donors, Howard and Kendra and many fans of local history attended.

After several speeches, acknowledgements, commissions, stories and general historical rhetoric, Kendra and Howard headed back to New Smyrna Beach with a stop at our favorite Silver Diner in Daytona Beach for a late lunch. The last minute decision to attend this historic event was a good one. The Birthplace

of Speed Park, with it's several racing monuments, was worth the visit. And now it has one more.







Editor's Note: Ormond Beach, Florida is located about 20 minutes north of Daytona Beach, FL on Highway A1A.

COVER VEHICLE FEATURE ARTICLE

1936 Buick Special Victoria Coupe

Owner: Thomas Tart, Florida Region member

- 1) This Buick has been owned by one family since new. Tom's mother, Lib Tart, gifted him this car when Tom was in high school. In 1936 this car cost \$845 new. Tom said you could buy two '36 Fords or two '36 Chevys for the price of this one '36 Buick. The interior features a "banjo" steering wheel, 2 sunvisors, a deluxe heater and a 3 speed transmission. The car has under 45,000 original miles. This car was driven to the White House when FDR was in office. Tom drives this car in local parades. U.S. Senator Bill Nelson often rides in this car in parades.
- 2) The straight 8 engine displaces 233 cubic inches and has 93 horsepower at 3,200 rpms with 183 ft-lbs. of torque at 1,900 rpms. The engine has no oil filter. The engine idles smooth like a sewing machine.
- 3) The car is painted "Cardinal Maroon". 1936 was the first year where the rear trunk was part of the body and the last year where the steel body had a wooden frame interior.
- 4) For 1936 only, Buick featured this "waterfall grill". and a very rare "modern Indianhead hood ornament".
- 5) Tom has reproduction radial tires with "gangster whitewalls". This car features steel "artillery" wheels with hand painted striping. He gets 16 miles per gallon on the highway with a top speed of 60 mph. Weighing 3,305 pounds with a 118 inch wheelbase, the car rides very smoothly on the road.
