2014 Boca Raton Concours d'Elegance

An amazing collection of vehicles were on display at the 8th annual Boca Raton Concours d'Elegance held on February 23, 2014 on a golf course in Boca Raton, FL. The weather was clear with a high in the mid 80's. Vehicles on display ranged from brass era cars, concept cars, classic cars, motorcycles and modern luxury cars.

Mercedes-Benz was the featured marque at this show. Owners showed some museum quality vehicles including this functional 1886 Mercedes-Benz Motor Wagon reproduction, considered to be the first patented gasoline powered automobile in the world.



On the other side of the technology spectrum was this one-off **1928 Rolls Royce Torpedo** powered by a 27 liter V-12 Meteor aircraft engine (1,647 cubic inches)! It made 650 horsepower with open exhaust pipes. The body is teakwood planks over an ashwood frame.



Next to the **Torpedo** was a **1963 Chevrolet Corvette Roadster/Shark Coupe** owned by Harley J. Earl, the Vice President of Design for General Motors from 1928 to 1958. The car was a gift from General Motors to him.



Our club's former President, Darrel Cole, won a Best in Class award for "American Classic" and a Sponsor's Trophy for his burgundy **1929 Packard 640 Phaeton**.



This **1948 Playboy Coupe** was a "barn find". It is one of 97 made and one of 12 functional cars left in the world.

1940 Ford Deluxe Opera Coupe

- 1) The Yancey's acquired this car in 1991 from Paula and Larry Cotton of Dallas, Texas who completed a frame off restoration and were the car's second owners. This car is an "Opera Coupe" because there are two folding seats behind the split front bench seat. This car has a Columbia 2 speed rearend which lowers the engine rpms at highway speeds. The car wears upgraded 6.0 x 16 radial tires on stock steel wheels with a chrome hubcap and beauty rings.
- 2) The 221 cubic inch (3.6 liter) flat head V-8 engine develops 85 horsepower @ 3,800 rpms with 157 ft. lbs. of torque @ 2,200 rpms. It still retains its stock 6 volt electrical system. The Columbia 2 speed overdrive cable mechanism is seen to the left of the brake master cylinder.
- 3) This car's two factory accessories are an AM radio and a working clock in the glove box door. The Columbia overdrive actuator switch is located to the left of the steering wheel under the push button starter switch. The 3 speed manual transmission is column shifted.
- 4) The spacious trunk has a small storage area for tools and a jack. The Garnet Maroon enamel paint on this car is thought to be all original except for a repainted trunk lid. There were 20,183 Deluxe coupes made in 1940.
- **5**) The Yanceys enjoy driving this car around town. It has been driven in several local parades. At a weight of 2,940 pounds on a 112 inch wheelbase this car accelerates easily and drives smoothly on the road.

This 1950 Crosley Hot Shot Convertible (Lot 638) sold at the Janaury 2014 Barrett–Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona for \$26,400. (4 Cylinder, 3 Speed Manual). "Powel Crosley Jr. of Cincinnati, OH built radios and refrigerators. In 1939 he built his first car and sold it for \$250. 1950 was the first year for the Hot Shot 44 cid engine with 26.5hp. 1952 was the last year of production of Crosley automobiles. This 1950 Hot Shot is the most equipped Hot Shot many in the Crosley National Club have ever seen. Radio, heater, ashtrays, top, doors and lots of chrome".
