Same Car Owner for 82 Years

"Mr. Allen Swift: Born: 1908, Died 2010. This man owned and drove the same car for 82 YEARS. Mr. Allen Swift (Springfield, MA) received this 1928 Rolls-Royce Piccadilly-**P1 Roadster** from his father, brand new – as a graduation gift in 1928. He drove it, up until his death in 2010 at the age of 102. He was the oldest, living owner of a car that was purchased new. It was donated to a Springfield museum after his death. It has 1,070,000 miles on it, still runs like a Swiss watch, dead silent at any speed and is in perfect, cosmetic condition at 82 years of age. That's approximately 13,048 miles per year, 1,087 miles per month. 1,070,000! That's miles not kilometers! That's British engineering from a bygone era."

1933 Chrysler Six Series CO Four Door Sedan

1) The McMullen's bought this car in January 2014 out of Chicago in its present restored condition. It earned its AACA Senior badge at this year's AACA Winter National Meet in Port St. Lucie, FL. In addition to the two side mount tires with covers , split windshield, dual cowl vents this car features a fold down trunk rack for the luggage.


2) The 224 cubic inch (3.7 liter) L-head straight six engine develops 83 horsepower @ 3,400 rpms which was comparable to a 1933 Ford V-8 that had 85 horsepower. In 1933, this was a revolutionary new six-cylinder with a high-compression (5 to 1) engine with a seven-bearing crankshaft. This car retains the original 6 volt electrical system. The car starts easily and runs smoothly.

3) The interior has very comfortable fabric seats, front and back, for 5 adults. The car features a 3 speed, floor mounted transmission and 4 wheel hydraulic drum brakes. The metal dash is painted a wood grain finish.

4) Plenty of chrome is featured on the front end of this car including the leaping gazelle hood ornament. There were 13,264 four door sedans made in 1933.

5) With a 117 inch wheelbase and a weight of 3,143 pounds this car accelerates briskly and rides smoothly on the road. Bob says she will cruise comfortably at 50 miles per hour on the 5.5 x 17 inch bias ply tires.
