Darrel presented Charlie Steffy's Treasurer's Report and it was filed.

There was a general discussion on the Great American Race that will leave Ogunquit, Maine on June 21st and end up at The Villages, Florida on June 29th, Sunday, more than 100 cars, all built before 1972, traversing through 13 East Coast states, 2100 miles.

1957 Oldsmobile Golden Rocket Series 88 Convertible

1) The Verner's bought this car in 1995 out of California and drove it back to Florida with "zero problems". A frame off restoration was completed in 2001. As part of the restoration, the frame was painted gold, like the engine valve covers, in honor of GM's 50th anniversary. This Olds got its AACA Senior badge in 2005 and most recently a Preservation Award in 2008. The vanity Florida license plate features the Space Shuttle as a nod to this "Golden Rocket". The car colors are Oldsmobile's Alcan White and Festival Red.

2) 1957 marked the last year that Harley Earl designed cars at General Motors. The Verner's have added two safety features since receiving their Preservation Award. A set of 215/75-15 radial tires replaced the stock 14 inch bias ply tires because the front end also received power disc brakes which required 15 wheels. The 15 inch wheels have been modified to accept the stock 14 inch hub caps. These upgrades were performed by John Adams from Apopka, FL.

3) The interior features comfortable vinyl seats. The 3 speed automatic transmission is shifted on the column. This convertible weighs 4,232 pounds on a 122.5 inch wheelbase. The original 1957 base price for this car was \$2,895. According to *Automotive Information Clearinghouse*, La Mesa California, there are only 41 of these convertible registered in the United States (4 in Florida) out of the 6,423 convertibles made in 1957.

4) The 371 Cubic Inch (6.1 liter) flathead V-8 engine develops 277 horsepower at 4,400 rpms and torque of 400 at 2,800 rpms using a factory four barrel Rochester carburetor. The electrical system is 12 volt. The modern power disc brake booster and master cylinder blends in. A highlight of their ownership of this Olds was in 1996 being the Grand Marshall lead car in a Disney parade with Bob Hope and his wife Dolores in the back seat.

Two Vintage Amphibious Military Vehicles

"These amphibious vehicles were widely used during the Vietnam War when about 500 of the 968 made were destroyed. Despite its aluminum construction, the LARC-V weighs 19,000 pounds. It is powered by a 300horsepower Cummins diesel V8 engine and reaches speeds of 35 miles per hour on land, and about 10 miles per hour in water. About 300 remain. The U.S. military has about 200 in inventory, and the rest are owned by civilians." LARC-V stands for Lighter, Amphibious Resupply, Cargo, 5 ton.



The **General Motors Corporation DUKW** (also known as "DUCK") was used to transport supplies from ship to shore during WWII. Around 2,000 **DUKW's** were used in Operation Overlord (D-Day) activities.

Some specs: 270 cubic inch (4.4 liter) GMC straight 6 cylinder engine, 94 horsepower, wieight of 7.5 tons, Length of 31 feet, top water speed of 6.4 mph, top road speed of 50 mph, cargo capacity of 5 tons, 6 wheel drive.

"The **DUKW** was the first vehicle to allow the driver to vary the tire pressure from inside the cab, ...The tires could be fully inflated for hard surfaces such as roads and less inflated for softer surfaces, especially beach sand. This added to great versatility as an amphibious vehicle. This feature is now standard on many military vehicles."
