
Auctions America Sales Results

1914 Roamer Speedster

Lot #771 Sold for \$46,750

"Displaying the Rochester–Duesenberg engine, manual gearbox, Regal frame and tidy angular fenders make for an impressive period piece. Buffalo wire wheels, monocle windshield, motometer, tufted individual seating and many brass components.."



Lot #128 Sold for \$5,500

"The **Nash** is powered by its 195.6 cubic inch, 100-hp inline six cylinder engine that is backed by a column shift three speed manual transmission with optional overdrive... Among the factory features there is a hood ornament, oil-bath air cleaner, Weather Eye heater, radio delete, clock delete, distinctive trim components, hubcaps and whitewall tires. "



1947 Studebaker Commander Regal Deluxe Convertible Lot #188 Sold for \$36,300

"First by Far with a Post-War Car" has gone down in history as one of the most iconic advertising slogans of the 1940s. The **Studebaker** factory in South Bend, Indiana, was able to beat just about every other major American manufacturer to market with an all-new automobile, which was introduced in June 1946 as a 1947 model. Lower, wider, and with redesigned chassis and suspension, the cars featured innovative new styling by Raymond Loewy, which was, at the time, controversial. Today, it has come to be seen as one of the most unique and attractive postwar American cars and as a design landmark that forecasted ultramodern **Studebakers** from Loewy's hand.

Both **1947 Studebaker** models had six cylinder engines, with the top–of–the–line **Commander** having the more powerful 94 horsepower version. The **Commander Convertible** was offered only in **Regal Deluxe** trim, with stainless steel windshield trim and rocker panel moldings, to add a bit of additional flair. With only 1,503 built, it was scarce on the road even when new. Few have survived and fewer still are road worthy, and even fewer still have enjoyed high-quality restorations."



1936 DeSoto Airflow Sedan Lot #744 Sold for \$39,050

"In 1934 the entire **DeSoto** lineup featured Chrysler Corporation's new streamlined **Airflow** design. A design far ahead of its time, it featured built in headlamps and wider front seats that could accommodate three adults abreast. The hood was extended past the front axle, the rear fenders had full fender skirts; there was a rounded radiator grille and a modified vee shaped windshield were some of the styling features that set this car apart from anything ever seen on North American shores. One of the major payoffs of the **Airflow** design was greatly increased fuel economy over traditionally styled vehicles of the era. Harry Hartz managed a cross continental road trip from New York City to San Francisco, California with a total fuel bill of just \$33.06, averaging better than 22 miles per gallon.

The **1936 DeSoto Airflow** presented here is powered by a 241.5 cubic inch inline six cylinder engine with a floor shift three speed manual transmission. The **Airflow** is presented in burgundy with tan cloth interior. The car has many distinctive trim styling elements that blend well with this standout design. Fender skirts, artillery type wheels and wide whitewall tires are also found on the **DeSoto.**"

1966 Ford Mustang GT Convertible

1) The Lane's bought this car in 2003 in New York from the second owner. The car showed 35,000 miles on the odometer when they bought it. All the body panels and chrome bumpers are original to the car. The car was treated to a "light" restoration over a 3 year period. Over a 7 year period it was judged at numerous national Mustang Club of America and AACA events throughout the country in the Concours Trailered category.

2) The 289 cubic inch (4.7 liter) V-8 engine was rated at 225 horsepower which makes this a "GT" model. Amazingly, this is the original 1966 date coded engine (original cylinder bore size) that was only upgraded with hardened valve seats. Only 13% of all 1966 Mustangs made (642,500) were convertibles. Even less were GTs.

3) The interior has all the options for 1966 except the center console and rally-pac cluster on the steering column. This was as the car was delivered in 1966.

4) The car runs on "dual red line" 6.95 – 14 bias ply tires mounted on chrome styled steel wheels (an option in 1966). The trunk features the original 1966 convertible top boot cover. All the original paint drips and imperfections from the factory were purposely left "as is" during the restoration.

5) The Lane's aren't afraid to drive their "Signalflare Red" car now that it is "retired" from judged events. The car starts easily and runs smoothly down the road.
