

This vehicle was restored from an empty hull in 2012-2013. It has the more powerful R-975 C4 motor which makes it the fastest most powerful WWII tank you will drive. The motor was rebuilt in 2013 as well and runs perfectly. The tank has a little joe generator which is fully functional as well as a functional turret motor. Gun is not live, and the breech has been demilled.

Historical Information

The M18 Hellcat (also known as the M18 Gun Motor Carriage, M18 GMC) was an American tank destroyer of World War II, used in the Italian and European theatres. It was the fastest armored vehicle until the turbine powered M1 Abrams tank appeared decades later. The speed was attained by keeping armor to a minimum, no more than one inch thick, and by powering the relatively small vehicle with a radial engine originally designed for aircraft usage. The Hellcat, along with the M10 Wolverine and M36 tank destroyer, provided American and Allied forces with a respectable mobile anti-tank capability against the newer German armored types. Despite being armed with an only partially effective 76 mm cannon,

it performed well.

The Hellcat holds the record for most effective American tank destroyer during World War II. It has a higher kill to loss ratio than any tank or tank destroyer fielded by American forces in World War II

1941 Ford Half–Ton Pickup

- 1) Bill bought the truck from the son of the original owner in 1984. It had a seized engine. He spent the next 30 years gathering parts. Restoration included replacing the truck frame, some rechroming and rebuilding the engine. The truck is painted a late model Dodge "Viper Red" color.
- 2) The 239 cubic inch (3.9 liter) V–8 flathead engine with 2 barrel carburetor is rated at 85 horsepower and is from a 1946 Ford. The engine has an oil bath air filter. The original 6 volt electrical system is retained. In 1941, the other engine options were a 4 cylinder (from a **Ford 9N tractor**) and a straight 6 cylinder flathead.
- 3) Bill added a LeBaron Bonney interior. The bench seat is green vinyl. The 3 speed manual floor mounted shifter is retained. Bill added a rear view interior mirror and a passenger side outside mirror. There are no sun visors.
- 4) A chrome rear bumper, chrome tailpipe extension and a right side taillight were truck options in 1941. The truck bed floor is all steel. A wood floor in the truck bed became available in 1942. A wood stake bed was an option in 1941.
- 5) Bill and Cloteen enjoy driving the truck to local area car shows and nearby car events. The truck has a 112 inch wheelbase and rides on 6.50 –16 Firestone bias ply tires. Original suspension is transverse leaf springs front and rear with lever shocks. Bill says the truck runs comfortably up to 60 mph.

Some scratches in the paint, Several rust spots on the frame. Side windows are old and drivers side has a crack... Engine does not smoke and the over drive works... Interior is decent...."

"In 1916, gasoline was cheap, and no one cared about tailpipe emissions. But this hybrid wasn't about fuel prices or pollution. Woods Motor Vehicle Company built it to capture new customers. Sales of the company's electric cars were falling as more people chose gasoline-burning cars. The Dual-Power supposedly combined the best of both, but customers disagreed. The car and the company disappeared in 1918."
