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

1953 EMW 327 Cabriolet

"Until the 1950's, **BMW** automobiles were produced not in Munich, but at the factory in Eisenach, which is located in what was then Eastern Germany. Because of the factory's location, it fell under Soviet control, and production of prewar **BMW** cars resumed after the war with no corporate connection to **BMW** in Munich. When the Soviets transferred the ownership of the company to the government of East Germany in 1952, **BMW** initiated legal proceedings, resulting in the renaming of the Eisenach company to **EMW** (**Eisenach Motor Works**)".

Sold on eBay

This **1959 Austin Gipsy** (Note: not Gypsy) 4X4 (with 16,873 miles) with its 4 cylinder engine and standard transmission in the bed, located in California sold for \$3,850 on December 7, 2015 (16 bids).

The **Austin Gipsy** was made from 1958 to 1968 in the United Kingdom and was a competitor to **Land Rover**. It was powered by a 2.2 liter (134 cubic inches) 55 horsepower gasoline engine and rode on a 90 or 111 inch wheelbase. Only 21,208 **Gipsys** were sold.

Seller's description says...

"Frame has no rust and never hit...Complete Project. Very straight and solid. Three owner, stored indoors for 25 plus years. .. Engine and trans are strapped in the bed. ..Has original upholstery and all original glass. Top bows are complete and a vinyl top is there for a pattern."



1911 Metallurgique Speedster

The **Metallurgique** were made in Belgium between 1898 and 1927. It was powered by a 4 cylinder engine rated at 14 horsepower. Wheelbase is 106 inches & weighs 2,464 pounds. It's one of the earliest known boat tail speedsters.



1970 – 1975 Citroën SM: Franco-Italian Gran Turismo

Made by the French car company Citroën.

Model name SM stood for Sports **Maserati.**

Powered by an all aluminum Italian **Maserati** V–6 (90–degree, 2.7 or 3.0 Liter engine) with double overhead camshafts and 3 Weber carburetors.

High performance, highly sophisticated front wheel drive, 3 door hatchback Grand Touring Coupe capable of a claimed 140 mph.

Single hydraulic system worked the suspension, steering and brakes (uses special hydraulic fluid).

Uses **Citroën's** hydro–pneumatic (oleopneumatic) self–leveling suspension.





Four wheel disc brakes. Front brakes were located inboard in the engine compartment!



Citroën offered the car with a 5–speed manual, or a 3–speed Borg Warner automatic transmission.

Citroën built around 13,000 SMs during the model's 1970–1975 run, of which only 2,037 were exported to the United States.



In 1968, **Citroën** bought **Maserati** with the intention of combining **Maserati's** high performance engine technology with **Citroën** sophisticated hydraulic suspension.

In 1974, **Peugeot** purchased **Citroën** under bankruptcy and quit building the SM model in 1975, which sold only 115 units that year.
