This month's cover features the 1948 Nash four door sedan. Nash offered two series of car this year, the 600 and the Ambassador. The 600 cars had a 173 cu. in. 85 hp L-head six and rode on a 112 inch wheelbase. The Ambassadors had a 235 cu. in. hp L-head six and rode on a 121 inch wheelbase. Factory prices ranged from \$1,478 for a 600 series business coupe to \$2,355 for an Ambassador Customline convertible. Directional signals and foam rubber cushions were factory options available this year. This was the last year that the Nash came on a separate frame. Calendar year production was 118,621 units or approximately 3% of the U. S. market. Company founder, Charles Nash, died at the age of 84 on June 6, 1948.

President's Letter

From all appearances the two-year planning effort that went into preparation for the Founders Tour resulted in a very successful event. Beginning with the opening banquet on Sunday April 17th to the closing banquet on Friday April 22nd, everything fell into place as planned. This was my first tour and while I was able to participate only on Friday and the opening and closing banquets those were all enjoyable. A big thank you goes out to the Tour organizers Gene Roy and Tom Holt as well as the many Florida Region members who handled all the tasks required to make the Tour a success.

We have one AACA Regional car show left this spring. The Volusia Region's Lake Helen Heritage Classic Show is set for Saturday, April 30 in Blake Park, Lake Helen. This show usually has 150 to 200 vehicles and is held in a nice setting.

With the May Florida Region meeting on the 9th, we will return to regular programming. The goody bag stuffing performed on April 11th went quickly and was one of the final preparations for the Tour. Al Adkins has arranged the May and June programs so we know they will be interesting.

I received a stack of raffle tickets from AACA National. For a \$20.00 donation you have the chance to win one of the following prizes. First prize is a 2000 Plymouth Prowler, Second prize is a 2010 Harley Davidson and third prize is \$3,000.00 cash. The donation goes to support the AACA Library and Research Center and the AACA Museum. The drawing will be held at Hershey on October 8, 2011 and one does not need to be present to win. Following a forty-two year interlude, on April 10th I was back riding my Go-Kart. This little motorized racing vehicle was delivered to my house on January 3, 1961. I was 12 ¹/₂ years of age at the time. The original Go-Kart Manufacturing Co manufactured it in Azusa, California. I worked to save money back in that day and was matched with a contribution from my father. Bush Holley, the local Harley Davidson dealer and Phil Bachman now a GM dealer who were selling karts in my hometown of Greeneville, TN, delivered the kart assembled in a big box.

For three days after the delivery rain fell constantly so all I could do was look at it sitting in the basement of our house. The original engine was a $2-\frac{1}{2}$ hp

Clinton two cycle. After a few months of riding with Clinton power we sold that engine and installed a McCullough MC-6. The MC-6 was one of the best power plants going then for a single engine and allowed for speeds in the 50 mph range.

The Greeneville Go-Kart track was a quarter mile paved somewhat in the form of a four-leaf clover. We rode there as well as area tracks in Newport, TN and Johnson City, TN. The kart is in the original condition as when I last rode it in June 1969.

Last year I had a chance meeting with another older go-kart enthusiast who told me about vintage kart groups in Ocala and Jacksonville, FL. That conversation spurred me to have the carburetor rebuilt and a weld done at the seat/frame junction. I installed a new spark plug and replaced the forty five year old racing slicks with a new set, obtained a new drive chain, greased the Timken tapered roller bearings, tracked down a source who could tell me the proper settings for the two adjustments on the carburetor and was ready to go.

My kart has direct drive with a solid live axle and no centrifugal clutch so starting it is by either pushing it then jumping into the seat or being pushed. I had two big boys attempt to push me but with no success. The engine fired but did not stay running before the pushers ran out of energy. A neighbor who has a large electric powered riding cart devised a towline and started pulling me on the paved road that we share. After about a quarter of a mile of pulling the McCullough roared to life stayed running and it was the 1960's again!

There is nothing like 50 mph two inches above the ground. The shake down run exposed a little problem with the throttle plus the shut off valve at the bottom of the gas tank dripped when opened. I hope to solve those little items soon and make contact with the Ocala and Jacksonville vintage kart riders.

It surely was good to have Gene Roy present at the Tour closing banquet last evening. To all of our Region members who are contending with medical issues, you remain in our thoughts and prayers and we hope that you will be able to join in Region activities soon.

Bob Coolidge also requested the General Membership to seek out possible Florida Region Auto Show venues.


Tom Holt discussed times (hours) for different functions of the Founders Tour.


The 50/50 raffle was won by Pat Dunkin. Silver Dollar winners were Bill Morris, Patti, and Bill Pyle.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15pm (including Goody Bags).


