1914 Cadillac Model 30 “Fat Man”

The hinged steering wheel featured on the 1914 Cadillac Model 30 was dubbed the “Fat Man.” It allowed larger drivers to move the steering wheel away from their bodies giving more space for a driver to climb into

and out of the vehicle with a greater measure of comfort and grace.



Cadillac built the Model 30, or the “Thirty” as it was called, from 1908 to 1914. With the “Thirty” in production, all prior models were discontinued and it became the company’s only offering for a time. The

Model 30 was available as a three-passenger Roadster, two-door Demi-Tonneau with seating for four, or a two-door, five-passenger Tourer.

Cadillac upgraded the Model 30 over the course of the vehicle’s production lifetime. During the vehicle’s last year of manufacture in 1914, the Model 30 transitioned to left-hand drive, a new floor-hinged steering wheel, and an optional electrically engaged two-speed direct-drive axle. This last component made high-speed driving a quieter experience and put less stress on the motor.
