The Kaiser Adventures of Howard A. "Dutch" Darrin

Following the war, Dutch Darrin signed on with Kaiser-Frazer as a freelance consultant, and was almost solely responsible for both the 1947 Kaiser and Frazer sheet metal.



His deal with Henry J. Kaiser paid him a 75 cent royalty for each Kaiser-Frazer car built. He again reined Kaiser-Frazer's next major project, the design of the unforgettable 1951 Kaiser Manhattan, with its rounded roofline, trapezoidal greenhouse-glass treatment and concave waterfall grille. In 1948 they needed a new design, and Dutch

returned to introduce "Speed-Styling," on what he called the "Constellation." A fresh approach in automotive architecture, its ultra-low aspect was achieved by new departures —a spare tire mounted under the trunk floor, curved doors extending into the roof, a chassis contour allowing a much lower rear seat and unprecedented glass area.





The same firm, however, would give Darrin the impetus for his magnum opus.



The Kaiser-Darrin sports car, Kaiser-Frazer's last gasp, saw a Henry J chassis and

powertrain slip beneath a Darrin-scribed fiberglass body with awkwardly sliding doors and lines that recalled nothing from his Packard glory years. Darrin ended up selling the final 50 cars himself, upgraded variously with supercharged Henry J flathead straight-sixes and 331-cu.in. Cadillac V-8s. Darrin continued on as a freelancer until he died in 1992.
