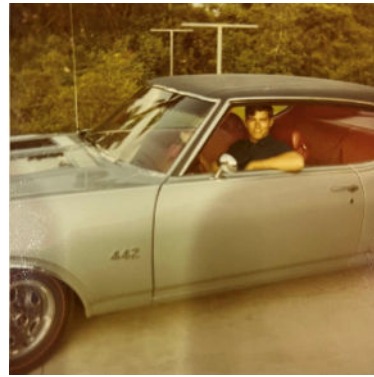
1969 Oldsmobile 442 Holiday Coupe:

Nostalgia:

For many years Bob talked about that car; first to me, then to our children, and then to our grandchildren but especially to the boys. Whenever they would watch car shows or auctions, he would always mention it and wonder if he would ever see his car on there and how he wished he had kept it.

The Search:

In 2020, when Bob was turning 70, I decided to try and find a car like his. I did not have the VIN number so I knew I could not find the exact car. However, I thought maybe I could find one similar and surprise him with it. I searched on the internet and found quite a few that were 1969 but none with his color combination, (silver exterior/red interior). I found silver ones, but they all had black interiors. I finally found one with a red interior, but it was black outside. I figured it could be painted to look like what he had. A client of ours deals in used cars so I asked him to look at the one I had found. It was in rough shape, and it was too much money for all the

work that had to be done on it so I let it go. Up to this point, I had not shared with anyone what I was wanting to do but I asked our son, Brock, to help me.

The inspector who looked it over told us the paint job was pristine, and the car was in amazing shape. It had been kept inside a garage in Michigan and Bob would be just the third owner. The

inspector told our son “If your mom doesn’t buy this car I will!” After it got down here, I had to do a lot of sneaking around getting the insurance, the license plate, storing it at our client’s car lot, going to inspect it, etc. Finally, in September of 2021, we surprised Bob with the car. He was shocked but it has been such fun to see how proud he is of the car and telling our love story of the original car and the one he has now.
