1953 Buick Skylark


1953 Oldsmobile Fiesta

Originally manufactured for the 1939
New York World's Fair,[5] the Futurliners
were later featured in GM's Parade of
Progress, a promotional caravan
traveling a 150-stop route across the
United States and Canada

Interrupted by World War II, the Futurliner vehicles were refurbished by GM and the Parade of Progress resumed in 1953. The reborn parade was discontinued in 1956 for the last time, displaced by increasing popularity of network television—one of the very technologies the Futurliners themselves had once promoted





This is one of only two Futurliners restored to their original glory. Experts from the National Auto and Truck Museum in Auburn, Indiana will host tours of the vehicle, answer questions and allow guests inside the Futurliner as well as allow photos and help take pictures for people as they experience this once in a lifetime opportunity!

At 33 feet long, 8 feet wide, more than 11 feet tall, and weighing more than 12 tons, each Futurliner featured heavily stylized art deco, streamlined bodywork, deep red side and white roof paint, large articulated chrome side panels, a military-grade 302 cubic inch GMC straight-six gasoline engine, whitewall tires and a prominent, high-mounted, centrally located driver command position with a panoramic windshield. A rarely seen technical feature was that the front wheels, in addition to rear

wheels, were also dual wheels.





The Futurliner that will be at the Lake Mirror Classic in Lakeland is owned by the NATMUS Museum in Auburn, Indiana. They had it in outside storage behind their museum for many years. It was #10 of 12 built.




It is true that the parade of progress made its first stop ever in Lakeland, FL in February, 1936. But the vehicles were not the same and were not called Futurliners. We have pictures of the originals, but none are known to exist. The one in the picture on the cover is one of the reconfigured ones after WW2. The big differences were the glass roof over the driver's compartment. with no ventilation and no A/C. The sun coming in made it a bake oven. They removed the glass and replaced it with metal. Still it was very hot.

Original version used a 4 cylinder Detroit Diesel that had a top speed of about 35 mph.



Later version used a 6 cylinder gasoline with top speed of about 45 mph.

It did not have an automatic transmission. It had 3 transmissions, but the third one was actually a power take off unit and not used for moving the bus. For motivation it had a 4 speed transmission and a 2 speed that was like a two speed rear axle, but it was not in the rear axle. This gave them 8 forward speeds.
