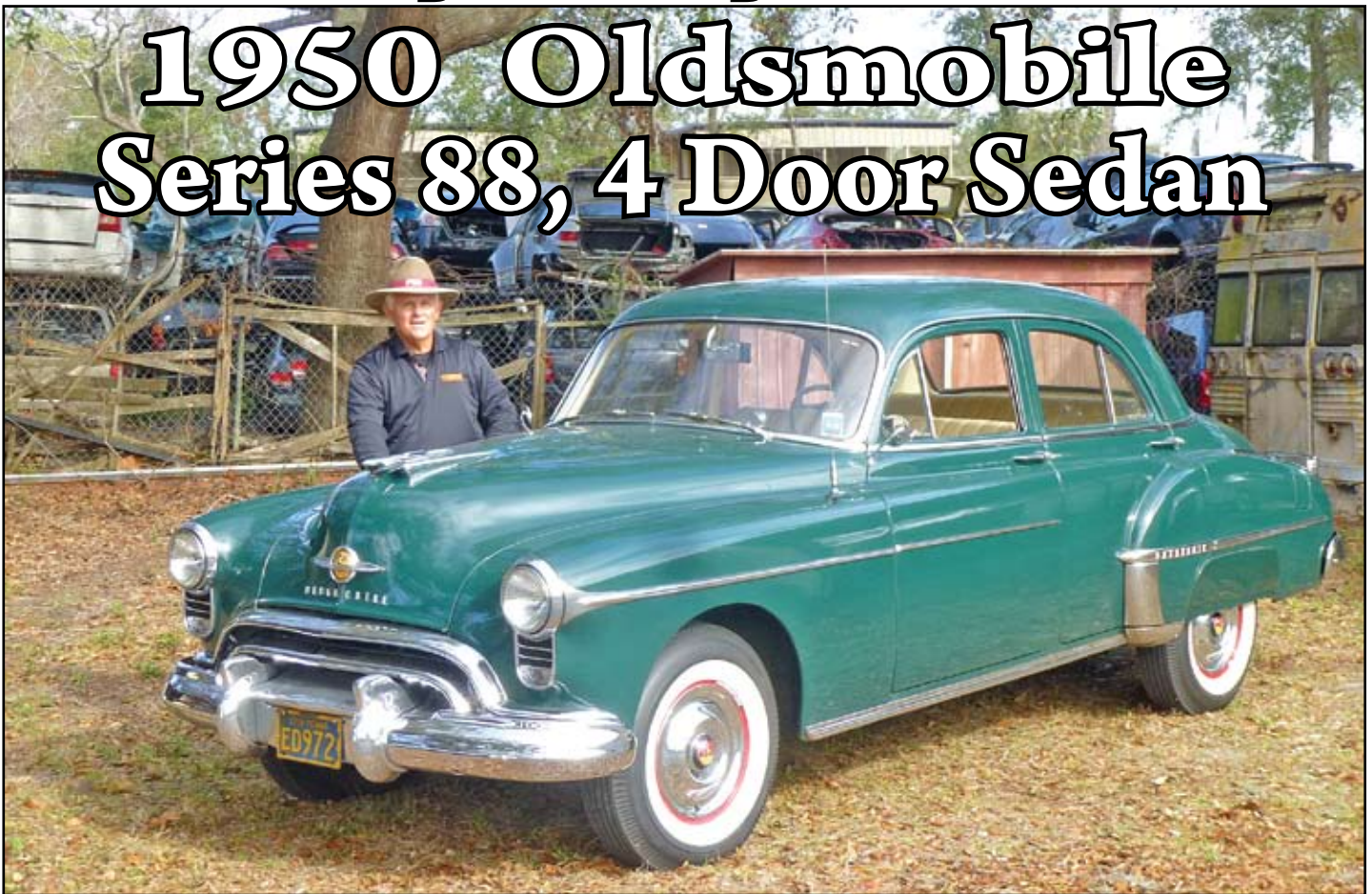

Workshop Idea

Here is an idea for your workshop...

PROBLEM: You need to mix two liquids in a certain proportion, say 1 to 1 mix ratio (2 ounces Part A with 2 ounces Part B), but you have no measuring cups on hand.

SOLUTION: Say you want a total of 4 ounces of mixed liquids. In a 8-ounce

plastic cup, use a flat piece of wood as a mixing stick. Guess where the halfway point is for the 8 ounce cup and make a horizontal mark on the stick. (For a total of 4 ounces). Measure the length of the first mark to the bottom of the stick, divide by half and make a second horizontal mark.

For example, your first horizontal mark measures 4 inches to the end of the stick. Make the second horizontal mark at 2 inches. Leave the mixing stick in the cup. Pour the first liquid to the lowest mark, then add the second liquid to the top mark. Now you can mix both liquids together.

This will also work for different mixing ratios. For example, for a 1 to 3 mixing ratio (for a total of 4 ounces), first mark is at 4 inches, second mark is 1 inch from the bottom of the stick.



Gene's Garage Visit

A January 2018 visit to Gene Roy's Garage in Casselberry, FL turned up a couple of interesting antique vehicles.

The first vehicle we saw was a miniature **1957 Chevrolet Corvette** with a Fairbanks Morse 4-stroke gasoline engine in the back. Braking is done with a leather strap around

a small drum. The steering wheel is offset to the left slightly. Not sure if two small kids can ride in this vehicle at the same time.

I was told these small cars were offered as a \$100 option for buyer's of **1957 Corvettes**. Current value, I was told, is over \$3,000.



Also at the garage was a customer's stunningly gorgeous restored red **1957 Chevrolet Belair Convertible**.

1950 Oldsmobile "88" 4 Door Sedan

1) Wayne bought this car online, sight unseen, in September 2016. The previous owner had the car in the 2016 feature movie "Fences" starring Denzel Washington. Wayne's car was featured in an online 2017 Father's Day commercial for the ride-sharing company Uber. The car will also be in a 2018 documentary "The Groveland 4".

2) The "Oldsmobile Rocket" engine displaces 303 cubic inches, (4.96 Liters) develops 135 horsepower at 3,600 rpms, and 263 torque at 1,800 rpms. The 2-barrel back draft Rochester carburetor does not have the common vertically exposed carburetor venturis. The car was converted to a 12-volt electrical system.

3) Restoration bills totaling \$18,000 came with the car. The interior (headliner, carpet, door panels & both seats) were redone with modern materials. Under the center dash is a factory optional chrome swing-a-way tissue dispenser. The 3-speed automatic transmission shifts like new. The car has manual steering and manual brakes.

4) Wide whitewall BF Goodrich Silvertown bias ply tires (7.60 x 15) are adequate tires for today's roads. The "Futuramic" name is stamped in the side trim. The entire car was wet-sanded to bring out the car's green paint.

5) Wayne says it is a "smooth running car" that cruises easily at 50 miles per hour. At 3,535 pounds in weight and 119.5 inch wheelbase the car rides great. Wayne plans to keep the car as original as possible under his ownership.



Seen on the Road

On January 26, 2018, while driving around downtown Eustis, FL, I saw a **1941 Cadillac Convertible**. The car was parked outside a machine shop off the main road without a hood on it and with no one around. I took some photos.



I finally met the car's owner who told me he is on the last stages of the restoration.

The car's interior is still unfinished. The original flathead V-8 engine started up easily and ran smoothly. The only modification to the engine was a small 12-volt late-model alternator in place of the generator.

Garage Tour

On January 20, 2018, Bill Morris and I visited a 6,000 square warehouse owned by a dentist near Edgewater, FL. His eclectic vehicle collection included antique bicycles, scooters, a real 1932 Ford shell and 1960's Corvettes and Mustangs. This one vehicle caught my eye. A real **1964 Cobra MK II** (#CSX2204) with a 289 cubic inch Ford V-8 engine that he bought many years ago in Hershey, Pennsylvania. He said it came from a museum in Japan. He also stated, "the aluminum body dents very easily". Current value is north of \$1 million.
